

## about AHA workshops

Workshops for people who call themselves artists and for creative-types who don't! They're designed to help you develop and expand your artistic practice. Getting ideas heard and work seen is important — with expanded skills to show and explain your work you stand a much greater chance of exciting others (funders, partners, galleries, participants, audiences).

The workshops this May through July are a trial-run. Those in June and July will include topics such as how to be self-employed and legal structures, video and audio recording and editing, web design and page layout for print and on-line use. Your feedback will help us refine what we offer in future — it's important to us that it fits your needs. If there's a workshop you'd like to see us offer, get in touch.

The AHA teaching style is open and flexible, with workshops influenced by the participants as much as by the facilitator(s). Workshops are limited to a maximum of ten participants and a minimum of five. Pre-booking is essential.
